### News of Cremation Niches

There has been a little confusion for a few people as they have inquired about purchasing a niche for cremation urns in the new columbarium at Old Santa Rosa Chapel Cemetery. The price includes the niche, interment services, care and recording fees. If someone inquires about the price of a niche at the local public cemetery, that price is only for the niche but none of these other necessary items, which are additional. For instance, one niche that would hold two urns would cost \$3,300 at the Catholic cemetery, while it would cost \$2,900 for the same niche-for-two and necessary items at the public cemetery. The additional fees at the public cemetery can be paid at a later date, but those prices will be increasing; these fees at the Catholic cemetery are established and incorporated in the total price. (There is also an additional non-resident fee of several hundred dollars at the public cemetery, but no such fee at the Catholic cemetery, as of now.)
