


ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Saint of the Week

St. Aloysius Gonzaga; June 21 (1568-1591) Born an imperial prince in Lombardy, while still young, Aloysius began to practice prayer and penance and reject the values of his position and family. Against great resistance he gave up his inheritance and joined the Jesuits, hoping to go to the missions. Instead, when plague broke out in Rome, Aloysius offered to serve the sick and dying in a hospital. He caught the plague and died three months later. May we imitate his zeal for God and learn that "the wish to love God includes a willingness to suffer for God's sake." (Living with Christ, June 2018)
